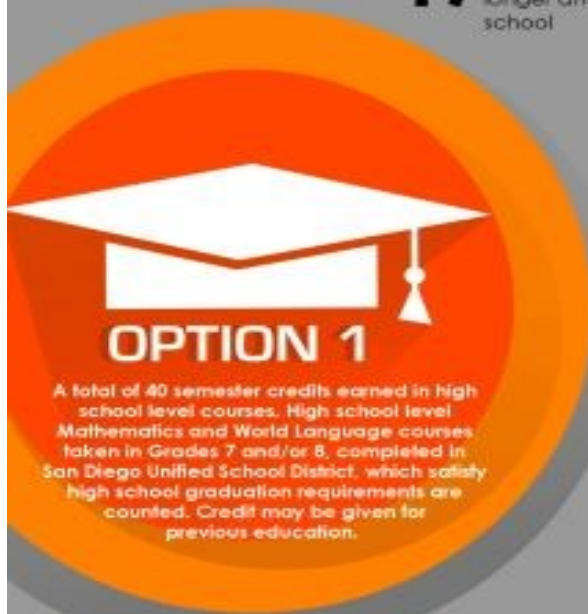
18 AND 19 YEAR OLDS

OPTION 2

A minimum of 22 semester credits earned in high school level (Grades 9-12) AND a two-unit college level course completed at an accredited community college OR equivalent.



OPTION 1

A total of 40 semester credits earned in high school level courses. High school level Mathematics and World Language courses taken in Grades 7 and/or 8, completed in San Diego Unified School District, which satisfy high school graduation requirements are counted. Credit may be given for previous education.

YOU CAN

Improve your reading, writing, and math skills and complete course requirements to obtain the **Adult Education High School Diploma**.

EXPECTATIONS

Weekly online participation is expected. We recommend students work on their course a minimum of 15 hours per week to be on track. Communication with teacher and counselor is highly encouraged.

PROGRESS & GRADING

Progress is measured by letter grades **A, B, C, D, and F** (unsatisfactory).

OPTION 1

English/Language Arts (8 semester credits), including at least one credit in a course that emphasizes a range of American Literature

History/Social Studies (6 semester credits), including World History 1, 2; US History 1, 2; US Government 1; and Economics 1

Science (6 semester credits), including Biology 1, 2, plus four credits of the following courses: Earth Science 1, 2; Physics 1, 2 or Chemistry 1, 2 or equivalent

Mathematics (6 semester credits), including Algebra 1, 2; Geometry 1, 2; and Intermediate Algebra 1, 2 or Unifying Algebra and Geometry 1, 2 (or the equivalent) Intg. Math I, Intg. Math II

Fine Arts or Foreign Language (2 semester credits)

Electives (12 semester credits)

Minimum GPA of 2.0 (GPA is calculated on all high school level courses completed.)

OPTION 2

English/Language Arts (6 semester credits), including at least one credit in a course that emphasizes a range of American Literature

History/Social Studies (6 semester credits), including World History 1, 2; US History 1, 2; US Government 1; and Economics 1

Science (4 semester credits), including Biology 1, 2 and two credits of Physical Science (Chemistry, Physics, Earth Science)

Mathematics (4 semester credits), including Algebra 1, 2 or higher (or the equivalent) Intg. Math I, Intg. Math II, Intg. Math III

Visual and Performing Arts, Career and Technical Education or Foreign Language (2 semester credits)

College course (minimum 2 credits). A degree applicable minimum two-unit college level course, or equivalent course, must be completed at an accredited community college. If the required college course is completed at a San Diego Community College, the course tuition is waived.

Minimum GPA of 2.0. (GPA is calculated on all high school level courses completed. The college course, or equivalent, is not often included in GPA, unless the college course is part of the subject area and credit requirements.)
