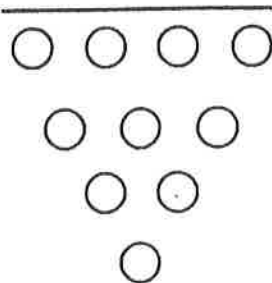
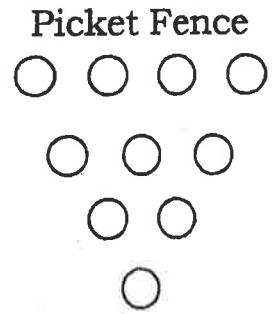
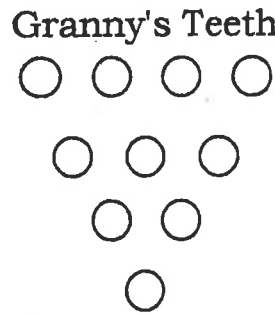
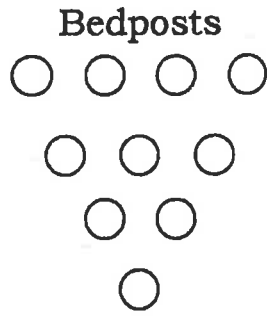
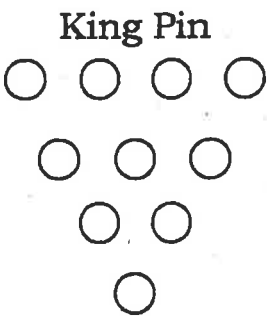
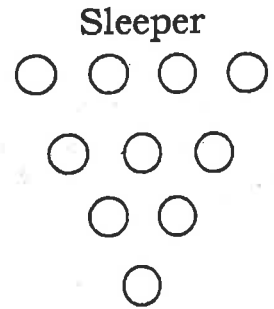
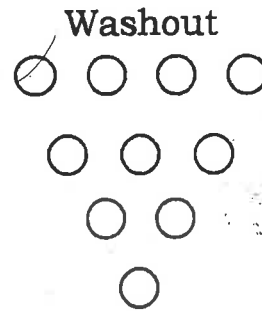
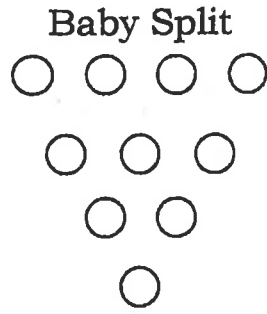
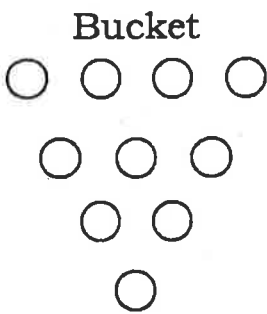
As in any sport or game, BOWLING has some special 'terminology'. Certain groups of pins that are left standing after the first ball are described by the following terms:

- Washout = 1-2-4-10 or 1-3-6-7
- Bucket = 2-4-5-8 or 3-5-6-9
- Bedposts = 7-10
- Granny's Teeth = 4-6-7-9-10 or 4-6-7-8-10
- Sleeper = 2-8, 3-9 or 1-5
- Baby Split = 3-10 or 2-7
- Picket Fence = 1-2-4-7 or 1-3-6-10
- King Pin = 5 pin
