Student Sexual Harassment & Nondiscrimination Policies (K-3rd Grades)

STUDENTS:

We want you to feel safe and protected at school. Students and adults do not have the right to make you feel uncomfortable or unsafe at school or during any school activity. **IT IS IMPORTANT NONE OF THE FOLLOWING THINGS HAPPEN TO YOU AT SCHOOL OR DURING ANY SCHOOL ACTIVITY.**

NO ONE SHOULD:

- touch your private parts or ask or make you touch their private parts or someone else's private parts. Your private parts are the areas covered by your swim suit, and no one is allowed to touch you there;
- talk to you using bad words or tell you to use bad words when talking to someone else, or talk to you or tell you to talk about private parts;
- tease you about being a boy or a girl, both, neither, transgender, or non-binary; or pick on you about your personal expression (how you show your gender with your hair, clothes, and outward style). For example, no one should tell you that you should or should not wear a certain color, kind of clothing, or that your hair should be long or short so that you look a certain way to fit what they expect.
- tease you or pick on you because of the color of your skin, or where you come from, or because you look different than they do.

IF ANY OF THESE THINGS HAPPEN TO YOU:

You need to tell your teacher or any adult working at your school. These adults **MUST** tell your principal or vice principal right away.

-OR-

Tell your parent or guardian, who can tell any adult working at your school. Your parent or guardian can contact the district to report the incident and/or get information on how to file a formal complaint (Board Policy and Administrative Regulation 1312.3) :
